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SECTION 1: GENERAL CONDITIONS OF BID

1. Proprietary Information

Industrial Development Corporation of SA Ltd (IDC) considers this Request for Proposal (RFP) and all related information, either written or verbal, which is provided to the respondent, to be proprietary to IDC. It shall be kept confidential by the respondent and its officers, employees, agents and representatives. The respondent shall not disclose, publish, or advertise this RFP or related information to any third party without the prior written consent of IDC.

2. Enquiries

- 2.2 Enquiries in relation to this RFP will not be entertained after **16h00 on 6 June 2016**.
- 2.3 The enquiries will be consolidated and IDC will issue one response and such response will be posted, within two days after the last day of enquiries, onto the IDC website (www.idc.co.za) under tenders i.e. next to the same RFP document.
- 2.4 The IDC may respond to any enquiry in its absolute discretion and the bidder acknowledges that it will have no claim against the IDC on the basis that its bid was disadvantaged by lack of information, or inability to resolve ambiguities.

3. Bid Validity Period

Responses to this RFP received from bidders will be valid for a period of 120 days counted from the bid closing date.

4. Instructions on submission of Bids

- 4.1 Bids should be **submitted** in duplicate (2 hard copies) and one electronic copy (on CD) in PDF format all bound in a sealed envelope endorsed, **T05/05/16: REQUEST FOR PROPOSAL TO CONDUCT A RESEARCH STUDY TO IDENTIFY POTENTIAL OPPORTUNITIES FOR FUEL CELL DEPLOYMENT IN SOUTH AFRICA'S TRANSPORT SECTOR**. The sealed envelope must be placed in the bid box at the Main Reception area of the IDC Building, 19 Fredman Drive Sandton by no later than 12:00 noon on Tuesday, 14 June 2016.
- 4.2 Bids must be submitted in the prescribed response format, herein reflected as **Response Format**.
- 4.3 The bid closing date, bidder name and the return address must also be endorsed on the envelope.
- 4.4 If a courier service company is being used for delivery of the bid response, the bid description must be endorsed on the delivery note/courier packaging and the courier must ensure that documents are placed / deposited into the bid box. **The IDC will not**

be held responsible for any delays where bid documents are handed to the IDC Receptionist.

- 4.5 No bid response received by telegram, telex, email, facsimile or similar medium will be considered.
- 4.6 Where a bid response is not in the bid box at the time of the bid closing, such a bid document will be regarded as a late bid. **It is the IDC's policy not to consider late bids for tender evaluation.**
- 4.7 Amended bids may be sent in an envelope marked "Amendment to bid" and should be placed in the bid box before the closing time.

5. Preparation of Bid Response

- 5.1 All the documentation submitted in response to this RFP must be in English.
- 5.2 The bidder is responsible for all the costs that it shall incur related to the preparation and submission of the bid document.
- 5.3 Bids submitted by bidders which are, or are comprised of companies must be signed by a person or persons duly authorised thereto by a resolution of the applicable Board of Directors, a copy of which Resolution, duly certified, must be submitted with the bid.
- 5.4 The bidder should check the numbers of the pages of its bid to satisfy itself that none are missing or duplicated. No liability will be accepted by IDC in regard to anything arising from the fact that pages of a bid are missing or duplicated.
- 5.5 A valid tax clearance certificate must be included in the bid response, or proof of application endorsed by SARS in this regard.

6. Supplier Performance Management

Supplier Performance Management is viewed by the IDC as a critical component in ensuring value for money acquisition and good supplier relations between the IDC and all its suppliers.

The successful bidder shall upon receipt of written notification of an award, be required to conclude a Service Level Agreement (SLA) with the IDC, which will form an integral part of the supply agreement. The SLA will serve as a tool to measure, monitor and assess the supplier's performance and ensure effective delivery of service, quality and value-add to IDC's business.

Successful bidders will be required to comply with the above condition, and also provide a scorecard on how their product / service offering is being measured to achieve the objectives of this condition.

7. Supplier Development

The IDC promotes enterprise development. In this regard, successful bidders may be required to mentor SMMEs and/ or Youth-Owned businesses. The implications of such arrangement will be subject to negotiations between the IDC and the successful bidder.

8. IDC's Rights

- 8.1 The IDC is entitled to amend any bid conditions, bid validity period, RFP specifications, or extend the bid closing date, all before the bid closing date. All bidders, to whom the RFP documents have been issued and where the IDC have record of such bidders, may be advised in writing of such amendments in good time and any such changes will also be posted on the IDC's website under the relevant tender information. All prospective bidders should therefore ensure that they visit the website regularly and before they submit their bid response to ensure that they are kept updated on any amendments in this regard.
- 8.2 The IDC reserves the right not to accept the lowest priced bid or any bid in part or in whole. It normally awards the contract to the bidder who proves to be fully capable of handling the contract and whose bid is functionally acceptable and/or financially advantageous to the IDC.
- 8.3 The IDC reserves the right to award this bid as a whole or in part.
- 8.4 The IDC reserves the right to conduct site visits at bidder's corporate offices and / or at client sites if so required.
- 8.5 The IDC reserves the right to consider the guidelines and prescribed hourly remuneration rates for consultants as provided in the **National Treasury Instruction 01 of 2013/2014: Cost Containment Measures**, where relevant.
- 8.6 The IDC reserves the right to request all relevant information, agreements and other documents to verify information supplied in the bid response. The bidder hereby gives consent to the IDC to conduct background checks, including FICA verification, on the bidding entity and any of its directors / trustees / shareholders / members.

9. Undertakings by the Bidder

- 9.1 By submitting a bid in response to the RFP, the bidder will be taken to offer to render all or any of the services described in the bid response submitted by it to the IDC on the terms and conditions and in accordance with the specifications stipulated in this RFP document.
- 9.2 The bidder shall prepare for a possible presentation should IDC require such and the bidder shall be notified thereof in good time before the actual presentation date. Such presentation may include a practical demonstration of products or services as called for in this RFP.
- 9.3 The bidder agrees that the offer contained in its bid shall remain binding upon him/her and receptive for acceptance by the IDC during the bid validity period indicated in the RFP and calculated from the bid closing hour and date such offer and its acceptance shall be subject to the terms and conditions contained in this RFP document read with the bid.
- 9.4 The bidder furthermore confirms that he/she has satisfied himself/herself as to the correctness and validity of his/her bid response; that the price(s) and rate(s) quoted cover all the work/item(s) specified in the bid response documents; and that the price(s) and rate(s) cover all his/her obligations under a resulting contract for the services contemplated in this RFP; and that he/she accepts that any mistakes regarding price(s) and calculations will be at his/her risk.

- 9.5 The successful bidder accepts full responsibility for the proper execution and fulfilment of all obligations and conditions devolving on him/her under the supply agreement and SLA to be concluded with IDC, as the principal(s) liable for the due fulfilment of such contract.
- 9.6 The bidder accepts that all costs incurred in the preparation, presentation and demonstration of the solution offered by it shall be for the account of the bidder. All supporting documentation and manuals submitted with its bid will become IDC property unless otherwise stated by the bidder/s at the time of submission.

10. Reasons for disqualification

- 10.1 The IDC reserves the right to disqualify any bidder which does any one or more of the following, and such disqualification may take place without prior notice to the offending bidder, however the bidder will be notified in writing of such disqualification:
- 10.1.1 bidders who do not submit a valid and original Tax Clearance Certificate or proof of application of such as endorsed by SARS **on the closing date and time of the bid**;
 - 10.1.2 bidders who submit incomplete information and documentation according to the requirements of this RFP document;
 - 10.1.3 bidders who submit information that is fraudulent, factually untrue or inaccurate information;
 - 10.1.4 bidders who receive information not available to other potential bidders through fraudulent means;
 - 10.1.5 bidders who do not comply with **mandatory requirements** if stipulated in the RFP document;
 - 10.1.6 bidders who fail to comply with FICA requirements;

11. Local Production and Content

The IDC promotes Local Production and Content. In the case of designated sectors, only locally produced goods, services or works or locally manufactured goods, with a stipulated minimum threshold for local production and content will be considered. IDC reserves the right at its sole discretion to set minimum thresholds for sectors which may not have been declared as designated sectors by the dti in an effort to stimulate local production and content where relevant.

Any misrepresentation in terms of the declaration constitutes a criminal offence as set out in the B-BBEE Act as amended.

Bids shall be evaluated in terms of the following process:

13.1 Phase 1: Initial Screening Process: During this phase, bid responses will be reviewed for purposes of assessing compliance with RFP requirements including the general bid conditions, which requirements include the following:

- Submission of Company Registration Forms as referenced 12.3.2 above
- Submission of ID copy for the Company Representative as referenced in 12.3.3 above

Failure to comply with the requirements assessed in Phase 1 (compliance), may lead to disqualification of bids.

13.2 Phase 2: Technical/ Functionality Evaluation

Bid responses will be evaluated in accordance with the Functional criteria as follows:

13.2.1 Other Functional/ Technical Requirements

With regard to the other Functional Requirements, the following criteria (set out in more detail in section 2 of this RFP document) and the associated weightings will be applicable:

Note: The minimum qualifying score for functionality is 70%. All bids that fail to achieve the minimum qualifying score on functionality shall not be considered for further evaluation on Price and BEE, in Phase 3.

13.3 Phase 3: Preference Point System

All bids that achieve the minimum qualifying score for Functionality (acceptable bids) will be evaluated further in terms of the preference point system, as follows:

14. Promotion of Emerging Black owned Service Providers

It is the IDC's objective to promote transformation across all industries and/ or sectors of the South African economy and as such, bidders are encouraged to partner with a black owned entity (being 50%+1 black owned and controlled). Such partnership may include the formation of a Joint Venture and/ or subcontracting agreement etc., where a portion of the work under this tender would be undertaken by black owned entities. To give effect to this requirement, bidders are required to submit a partnership / subcontracting proposal detailing the portion of work to be outsourced, level of involvement of the black owned partner and where relevant, submit a consolidated B-BBEE scorecard in-line with the provisions of the PPPFA Regulations which will be considered as part of the B-BBEE scoring listed in 13.3.

1. Special instructions to bidders

- 1.1 Should a bidder have reason to believe that the Functional Requirements are not open / fair and/or are written for a particular service provider; the bidder must notify IDC Procurement within five (5) days after publication of the RFP.
- 1.2 Bidders shall provide full and accurate answers to the questions posed in this RFP document, and, where required explicitly state either “Comply/Not Comply” regarding compliance with the requirements. Bidders **must** substantiate their response to all questions, including full details on how their proposal/solution will address specific functional/ technical requirements; failure to substantiate may lead to the bidder being disqualified. All documents as indicated must be supplied as part of the bid response.
- 1.3 Failure to comply with Mandatory Requirements may lead to the bidder being disqualified.

2. Purpose

The purpose of this tender is to appoint a service provider to conduct a study to investigate the opportunities for fuel cell deployment in the South African transportation sector. The study will focus on examining the potential for the use of fuel cells in the local transportation sector including policy interventions, infrastructure requirements and a key programme of action for effective market development and deployment.

3. Background Information

Government has prioritised mineral beneficiation as one of the key ways of promoting and expanding the manufacturing sector in the country.

Fuel cells have been identified as a strategic opportunity for the country given the abundance of Platinum Group Metals resources, the energy challenges, and also the need to create new demand for the metal and introduce environment friendly technologies.

One of the key aspects to fuel cells industrial development is the need to attract the major global fuel cells original equipment manufacturers to locate in South Africa (S.A.). These manufacturers have indicated that South Africa needs to create a sufficient demand for fuel cells to enable them to produce locally. The **dti** is working with the private sector and other government departments and agencies to explore ways of creating and expanding demand for fuel cells.

4. Problem Statement

The key enabler to fuel cells localisation is market development and off-take. It is envisaged that the biggest fuel cell market will be in the transport/mobile applications due to the required volumes. Fuel cells can provide clean and efficient power for buses, trucks, recreational vehicles, marine vessels, airplanes, locomotives, and other applications; including those that have auxiliary power demands.

In South Africa, the various Metros are also introducing rapid public transport systems in the form of Re A Vaya, A Re Yeng, and other such initiatives. It is also expected that more municipalities will also introduce these forms of mass transportation arrangements in the

near future. In the medium to long term; the transportation sector in general and the mass transportation initiatives in the Metros offer an opportunity for the country to introduce fuel cells. It is therefore key that government investigates the nature and extent of the opportunity for fuel cells introduction and deployment in transportation sector, potential impact and identify measures required to unlock the opportunity.

5. Objectives of the study

The objective of the study is to identify the opportunities and develop a clear programme of action on how the public sector transportation sector can be utilized to catalyse the required demand off-take requirements for the localisation of fuel cells in SA.

6. Methodology

The service provider is expected to outline the methodology that will be used to conduct the study. This methodology must be in accordance with generally accepted practices of research inclusive of primary and secondary data collection; data analysis; policy/ strategy analysis and development, and a set of interventions arising from the research which are ordered according to relative importance and time bound. Stakeholder engagement through interviews and meetings with relevant stakeholders will form an important part of the study.

7. Scope of Work

The scope of work should be based on achieving the objectives of the study and the work must be undertaken to a level that is sufficient to determine the feasibility of each proposed intervention.

The service provider will be required to perform the following:

- Conduct an assessment of the transport sector for the identification of opportunities of fuel cells in the public transportation sector;
- Conduct a benchmark and an analysis of other countries in terms of policies and incentives adopted to drive fuel cell industrialisation;
- Conduct an investigation on infrastructure requirements for large scale fuel cell deployment in the transportation sector;
- Conduct an investigation on the fuel types;
- Identify and engage with key government and private sector stakeholders and the engagements should include a determination on funding/ finance options;
- Examine the required interventions in terms of policy, regulatory, financial, infrastructure, human resource development (HRD), technology and research, development and innovation (RDI) requirements; and
- Determine and provide a programme of action to develop the market, infrastructure and deploy fuel cells in the identified applications with timelines.

8. Deliverables

The service provider will be required to deliver the following reports:

- Inception report - Draft scope, detailed outline of the methodology, work-plan and PowerPoint presentation 2 weeks after inception meeting;
- Interim progress report 1 - (public sector transportation opportunities, international benchmarking and analysis, infrastructure requirements and fuel types) including

PowerPoint presentation of report to project management team 3 months after inception;

- Interim progress report 2 - (required policy, regulatory, technology and financial interventions, programme of action, stakeholder engagement and feedback) including PowerPoint presentation of report to project management team 5 months after inception; and
- Final consolidated report including PowerPoint presentation of report to project management team 6 months after inception. The final report should provide a detailed analysis that will direct policy formulation and industrialisation to support the growth and development of the fuel cells industry in South Africa. The report should assess the opportunities; develop interventions and a proposed programme of action to support the development and deployment of fuel cells in the SA transportation market.

Note: Three bound hard copies of the final report in colour must be submitted along with 3 CD copies containing the report in PDF and MS Word format and any other materials that may be of use to further substantiate recommendations made in the main report.

9. Project Timelines

The appointed service provider(s) will be required to start immediately after signing the contract and the project should be completed within 6 (six) months from the date of inception.
